Yurok Behavioral Health Department

Department Overview:

The Yurok Tribe Behavioral Health Department provides culturally grounded, trauma informed behavioral health services that support the mental, emotional, and social wellbeing of Yurok Tribal members and their families.

The department offers prevention, early intervention, community based and outpatient supports, substance use and recovery services, crisis response, and care coordination, while working closely with Tribal and community partners to deliver wraparound, holistic care.

Tribal Child Welfare

Department Overview:

The Yurok Tribal Child Welfare (TCW) Program provides culturally responsive advocacy, prevention, and intervention services to support the safety, stability, and well-being of Yurok children and families. The program serves children and families experiencing or at risk of child abuse, neglect, victimization, and trauma.

TCW exercises tribal authority in all child welfare matters involving Yurok children and may formally intervene in state court proceedings pursuant to the Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA). The program's goal is to support families as early as possible in the child welfare process.

Department Overview (cont'd):

Priority is given to Yurok children and families who are enrolled members or eligible for enrollment. Eligible children and families receive supportive services designed to prevent further involvement with Child Welfare Services (CWS), reduce safety and risk concerns, stabilize families, and promote permanency.

Department Overview:

The Yurok Tribal Police Department is committed to protecting and supporting the safety, dignity, and independence of our elders through proactive, community-centered services.

While law enforcement is often associated with responding to emergencies, our role also includes prevention, education, & intervention.

We recognize that many risks facing elders, such as financial exploitation, scams, or unsafe living situations can develop over time, and our goal is to provide trusted support before those concerns become crises.



Yurok Tribal Police

Department Overview (cont'd):

Our department offers welfare checks to ensure the well-being of elders who may be living alone or who have not been heard from recently. These checks can be requested by the individual, family members, neighbors, or community partners, and are conducted with respect, care, and cultural awareness.

We also provide assistance in identifying and addressing potential elder abuse, including physical, emotional, or neglectful situations,

As well as concerns involving individuals who may be improperly using or occupying an elder's home or property.

Department Overview (cont'd):

We also offer security-oriented services for elders who may feel vulnerable or have concerns about their home environment.

This can include checking the perimeter of a residence, identifying potential safety risks, and providing practical recommendations to improve personal and property security.

These preventative measures are intended to give elders greater confidence and peace of mind in their daily lives.
